Whereas

Katwa College, hereafter referred to as **KC**, founded in 1948, is a co-educational college situated in Katwa, Purba Burdhaman. Affiliated to the University of Burdwan, it is aided by UGC and State government and accredited by NAAC, for the second cycle, where more than 7053 students pursue their B.A. B.SC. & B.Com. as well as two year B.Ed. courses. The college has its own campus at Katwa, Purba Bardhaman, West Bengal.

Whereas

- a. **D.D.C Girls' High School**, (hereinafter referred to as DDC) Katwa, Purba Bardhaman, West Bengal Pin Code: 713130 (INDIA), is one of the oldest and largest higher secondary (10+2) girls' schools in Katwa sub-division, Burdwan (now in Purba Bardhaman), West Bengal. It is located in Kachari Road, Ward No.-18 under Katwa Municipality. The school founded in 1927 & hereinafter referred to as **DDC**. It is a highly prestigious govt. sponsored school that shows its excellency not only in the avenue of education but also in sports and other co-curricular activities. **D.D.C Girls' High School** has produced many legendary personalities are versatile talent so far. Students of this school took a significant role in the freedom more than of India, hereinafter referred as the SECOND PARTY.
- b. KC is desirous to associate with DDC on various areas as discussed in the purvised MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both the institutions.

That, relying on the principle of good faith, by virtue of which they will carry out all the possible actions for their due fulfillment, and also relying on their common bonds and concerns, they state their interest in strengthening their relationships through academic cooperation, and to this end they are of one accord in entering this MoU.

THEREFORE, THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS:

1. SCOPE & OBJECTIVE OF THE MOU

Both parties agree that the objective of the present MoU is to establish cooperation in order to collaborate towards career development of students, promotion of academics and indifferent areas of interest.

2. METHOD FOR ACHIEVING THE OBJECTIVES

In order to achieve the above mentioned objectives, the parties, in mutual agreement, shall develop academic programmes and projects that will specify the commitments, each of them is to make for the performance of the said programmes.

3. AREAS OF COOPERATION:

Whereas **KC** and **DDC** recognize that the academic collaboration would be of mutual benefit and would provide strengths in research and education and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation. Following the purpose of the said agreement, the two parties shall engage in the activities stated below:

- 1. Collaborations in sharing Computer laboratory and ICT tools.
- 2. Collaborations in sharing infrastructural resources.
- 3. Knowledge sharing.
- 4. Laboratories sharing.
- 5. Implementation of Internship (School Internship) in B.Ed. Course.
- 6. Implementation of Summer Internship.
- 7. Interactive Exposure Visit.
- 8. Interpersonal relationship between two institutions.
- 9. Working together to spread education through the society.
- 10. Collaborations in implementation of social duties through NCC, NSS, & Nature Club.
- 11. Collaborations in implementation of Skill based & Vocational education.
- 12. Collaboration in educational project works.





- 14. Faculty exchange for scholarly pursuits.
- 15. Collaboration in youth development programme.
- 16. Collaboration in community & social outreach programme.
- 17. Jointly implementation of guidance and cancelling related activities.
- 18. Student Development Programmes.
- 19. Collaborations for Seminars/Webinars/Workshops.
- 20. Extension Activities with focus on education.
- 21. Collaboration in the area of Education and Teacher Training programmes formally kno as B Ed
- 22. Various kinds of Social and community development.
- 23. Sharing of Infrastructure for the purpose of Academic cause alone.
- 24. Collaboration in eliminating superstations and illiteracy.
- 25. Collaboration in conducting environment related activities.

4. FUNDING

- a. Expenses for maintaining infrastructure shall be borne by the respective institutions. The transportation and personal expenses of exchanging students, teachers or officers shall be covered by respective individuals/ Institutions.
- b. Financial expenses for internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution/s. No fees will be paid, to the professors/researchers as they remain in their positions at their home institution, which will continue to pay their salaries.

5. NO EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP

The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be construed in any manner as establishing any kind of partnership or bond of labour between them. Thus, in all activities stemming from the present MoU and from subsequent specific action plans, the parties are in the understanding that, in all cases, employment relationships shall remain in force between the employing institution and its respective personnel.

6. ACCREDITATION/ CERTIFICATION

The Institution shall issue certification recognizing the achievements of the students, on the basis of hours invested on projects/papers and successful completion of Add-On Courses of the enrolled students.

7. RIGHTS AND DUTIES

- a. The Host Institution is committed to counsel and support students through advice and to foster their integration, inviting and encouraging guest students to become involved in student life for the cause of promoting academics and research.
- b. The institutions shall act as facilitators, but they will have no obligation whatsoever in terms of the actions, behaviour or financial aspects of the students / participants involved in the exchange programme.
- c. The students/participants shall enjoy the same rights and privileges as regular students/faculty, and shall observe the norms and rules of the Host Institution. Any violation of the rules of the Host Institution by an exchange participant shall be grounds for immediate termination of the privileges in the context of this Agreement without any further clarification.
- d. The host institution agrees to provide workspace, library and laboratory facilities as appropriate for academic purpose.

8. AUTONOMY

This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any <u>financial obligations</u> between the participating Institutions

TERM 9.

- a. This MOU shall be effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall be renewed thereafter for another five (5) years subject to concurrence of both Institutions.
- b. It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

CONFLICT RESOLUTION 10.

Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each Institution. Either party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at any time in writing.

CONFIDENTIALITY 11.

Each of the parties accepts and declares that every information from the other party is of confidential nature and is the exclusive property of the latter and has been or will be disclosed to the former solely with the purpose of enabling the full accomplishment of the present Agreement. For this reason, every piece of information provided by one party to the other before signing this Agreement and/or during its performance must be kept confidential and therefore should not be disclosed to any third party.

AMENDMENTS 12.

The parties may amend this Agreement through agreements in writing to that effect. The said amendments or additions will be binding on the signatories as of the date of their signature. The parties may not assign, in whole or in part, the performance of the present MoU to any third party, except through prior and express authorization in writing by both of them.

And, since both parties are in agreement regarding the content of the present document, and as a token of conformity, we sign it in two counterparts, both of which will be considered originals.
